Vice President's Message:

I would like to thank all of the members of the AMAC for their confidence in me as Vice Pres. for the coming year. I will try to make our field as useful and enjoyable as I can.

We didn't have an opportunity to discuss what conditions and layout the members wanted at the field, perhaps we can devote some time to this at the next meeting in December. However, since so many members have approached me over the past few months to express their opinions I have to assume that what most of us want is a more flyer friendly field. By this it seems you want a somewhat wider main runway and an east/west runway of lesser dimensions, as this will accommodate a greater variety of wind conditions. Also many have commented that the "off runway areas should be cut shorter than in recent months so that their planes are not damaged if they stray off the intended landing areas. If we do this we will need to significantly increase the proposed budget for field maintenance or take a different approach to cutting the grass.

I have costed out purchasing a replacement tractor, roller, spreader and storage container. We could easily purchase these items, have a place to store the trainer/radio and other equipment etc, and still spend about half of the insurance money received from the fire. This would allow us to have a budget for field maintenance of less than half of the proposed amount.

If and when we move to a different field this can all be picked up and moved to another location at minimal cost.

I look forward to a hearty discussion on this issue.
